1752-2009

A place charged in history: from the General Hospital to the Royal Hainaut Spa & Resort.




The General Hospital of Charity, also known as the Hainaut Hospital, opened its doors in 1767 during the reign of Louis XV. Intended to accommodate the sick and marginalized from the entire province, this colossal building is an integral part of the heritage of the city of Valenciennes.

Throughout its history, it has served as a military hospital, a prison during the German occupation, and later as a hospice for the elderly.

Classified as a Historical Monument in 1945, the building represents a unique architectural heritage. Thanks to this extraordinary renovation, it will become a benchmark in luxury hospitality in the region. The story of this transformation began in 2009 when the town of Valenciennes and the hospital center decided to launch a consultation. The Financière Vauban was selected to create a luxury hotel.


An exceptional renovation

This is the story of the largest renovation project of a privately listed historical monument in France. At the peak of the project, 250 people worked on it. Technical feats and the craftsmanship of skilled artisans enhanced 450 blue stone vaults and 300 windows, totaling more than 15,000 m². A 13-meter-high glass canopy was erected. The roof was restored to its original state, with 11,000m² of slate, including the reinstatement of dormer windows just like in 1752!

In May 2019, the immense porch revealed an extraordinary urban hotel with a unique and unparalleled architecture. The architects managed to preserve the soul of the place while infusing it with the codes of the 21st century

Today, the Royal Hainaut remains an iconic address where elegance and refinement shine in this magnificent building. A unique destination, a prestigious 4-star hotel with 79 rooms and suites, a spa, and a pool, an Italian restaurant, a brasserie, two bars, and event spaces.

Rooms and suites



Decorator Séverine Lucas has infused a chic baroque spirit into the interiors of the rooms and suites. With a keen eye for detail and comfort, she played with volumes, generous furniture, and natural colors to enhance each space and create harmony between them. The essence of the place is preserved, and its character is modernized in a timeless manner.

The 80-square-meter duplex suite consists of a 45-square-meter living room, a duplex bedroom, and a bathroom.

The Royal Suite, located at the heart of the hotel, resembles a luxurious apartment with an area of 120 square meters. It features a living room, a dining room, two bedrooms, a shower room, and a bathroom. It offers a breathtaking view of the Atrium and the Courtyard.

79 rooms, including 42 suites with generously proportioned sizes ranging from 30 to 120 square meters, provide extreme comfort and absolute tranquility.

The Chef



The chef, Maxime Van-Hulle, orchestrates the cuisine of both restaurants. He has envisioned authentic culinary experiences filled with generosity and sharing. The chef creates his dishes according to the seasons, using products he selects from local producers. Each of his dishes expresses the truth of the ingredient.

With his brigade, united by the same passion and the desire to please, they convey emotions through their cuisine.

For the brasserie La Galerie restaurant, the recipes offer sincere and authentic cuisine that highlights local products. Like the famous Lucullus of Valenciennes, a true local specialty, which pairs with slow-cooked dishes like beef paleron cooked as a Flemish carbonade. For dessert, the chocolate mousse and hazelnut praline delight all gourmands.

For the Storia restaurant, he unveils a cuisine that pays homage to Italy by reimagining timeless classics. Authentic cuisine crafted with exclusive Italian products: white truffle from Piedmont, Vercelli rice, olive oil with a thousand nuances, Parma ham, and the finest wine appellations from all regions of Italy...



The pool was excavated under the foundations and interacts with the iconic blue stone columns of the Hauts-de-France.

The blue stone becomes a subject in itself as it structures the ambiance of the place, influences the diffusion of light, alters the colors of other materials, and affects the acoustic atmosphere.


This beautiful turquoise pool, measuring 22 meters in length and 10 meters in width, is heated to 29°C and its poolside area offers comfortable loungers for moments of rest and relaxation.

The Chapel, a unique place

The chapel of the Royal Hainaut is the largest hospital chapel in France.

With its vaults, period stained glass windows, and majestic nave, it is the focal point of the hotel.

Desanctified, the chapel has been transformed into a concert venue, such as Christophe Maé's private performance, as well as a grand reception hall for weddings or private dinners, and also for corporate events. It can accommodate up to 300 people.



Some key dates

1752: Construction decided by letters patent of King Louis XV.

1767: Inauguration and opening of the establishment.

1816 to 1818: Occupation of the North wing of the building by the army, and later by English troops.

1831 to 1894: North wing reserved for the military hospital.

1940: Destruction of the entire roof by a fire.

1945: Classification of the Valenciennes hospital as a historical monument.

1970 to 1984: Implementation of various renovation campaigns.

2013: Launch of the rehabilitation project for the Hainaut Hospital.

2019: Inauguration of the Royal Hainaut Spa & Resort Hotel.

Some addresses

The Mérignies Golf: Created in 2008, the Mérignies Golf is nicknamed 'the most undulating golf course in the flat country.' It covers a total of 185 hectares of nature near Valenciennes. With its 3 sets of 9 holes, the golf course offers harmony and technical challenges for both experienced and beginner players.

The Mormal Golf: takes you through a hilly landscape with hedgerows, orchards, and bodies of water near the forest. The 6022-meter, par-72 course is suitable for players of all skill levels.

The Matisse Museum: created by the painter himself during his lifetime. Over the years, the collections have grown, and today you can admire works by Picasso, Chagall, Giacometti...
